Dorothy was educated in the Baltimore City School System and taught herself a variety of clerical and office skills.

She worked a variety of jobs including: Assistant Librarian in Baltimore City Public Schools, the Internal Revenue Service and the Archdiocese in downtown Baltimore. She demonstrated her generosity of body, mind and spirit as an avid and eager volunteer collecting school supplies, shoes, clothing, furniture, eyeglasses food and water. These she donated to Daily Bread or to others who may benefit inside and outside of the US. She was also an enthusiastic political activist for senior citizens with Governor Martin O'Malley.

Later in life she married, Robert F. Hawkins Sr., a handsome history buff who was among the many people who had a special place in her heart. She believed that God kept her going, allowing her to do much of what she wanted to do, and a great deal of what God wanted her to do. This included extensive travel throughout the United States and beyond its borders and regular attendance at Mass until her illness. Dorothy had a huge open heart to give to those in need, helping when and where needed, and asking for nothing in return. She had a natural and easy ability to comfort people through sadness and to share in their joy as well. She was everything that a mother, grandmother, sister, daughter, aunt, friend, confidante and woman MUST be.
