Jeanne Marie Noble Washington was born January 10, 1935 to the late John Williams Noble and Dorothy Eaden Noble of Lynchburg, Virginia. Jeanne received her formal education at Yoder Elementary School and Dunbar High School of Lynchburg, Virginia, and Hampton Institute, Hampton, Virginia. She earned the Bachelor of Science Degree, as a Home Economics and Dietary Science major. Jeanne united in holy matrimony with Spurgeon Banks Washington, Jr., on September 20, 1969 at the Wayland Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland. Out of their union was born Spurgeon Banks Washington, III.

Jeanne was employed as a Dietician at Friendship Hospital of Washington, DC, Lutheran Hospital, Children's Hospital and Kernan Hospital of Baltimore, Maryland, as well as at the Clifton T. Once Jason was born: new child soon in first place, until Alexa and Jerrell arrived, all so special because these were her deceased, and ever beloved brother, "Uncle Bro's"—John Lewis Noble—grands.

Jeanne touched many lives - friends, family and co-workers, and they valued that she made each feel special. Jeanne was an attuned listener: anyone who knew Jeanne, whether as Aunt Jeanne, Jeanne or Mrs. Washington, could come to her and talk about anything without fear of judgement. Extremely witty and possessed of a wonderful sense of humor, and a really great conversationalist, she could banter with the best, including her doctors whom she challenged to always find a way to keep her in the fight.
