Ruth Brown Trapp, daughter of the late James Brown and Annie M. Brown was born July 16, 1927 in Pheba, Mississippi.

After completing high school, she relocated to Baltimore, Maryland where she attended a beauty college but decided this was not her passion. She then acquired a job with Bugle Laundry where she worked for over 35 years.

Ruth was the mother of three children, Marvin Cunningham, Sr., Percy Cunningham, Sr. and Edna Brown. In 1964 she married Joseph Trapp, this union lasted until his death in March 1999.

Ruth had a strong work ethic, she was a union steward on her job, loved to cook and she kept her house in pristine shape. During the holidays, she prepared food for family and neighbors. It was nothing to see 11 homemade sweet potato pies, coconut, egg custard, lemon meringue and cakes all baked from scratch and memory. She would have family members deliver them to neighbors, we will all miss those sweet potato pies!

A true homebody, who enjoyed talking on the telephone, she refused to step into the 21st century and upgrade to call waiting. Ruth's famous reply was "I can only talk to one person at a time". After retirement one of her favorite past times was frequenting the casino.

She had a keen sense of humor and was the queen of a clap back. Ruth made numerous friends wherever she went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew her.

What a blessing to Marvin and Edna to have their mother for 4 scores & 12 years = 92. Ruth saw many changes in her lifetime, she lived to see the first black president. What a joy that was for her to witness! Ruth was staunchly independent until early 2019, she was an early riser, even after retirement. Waking up every day at 5:00 A.M. to cook, clean or just watch television.

Ruth was preceded in death by her husband, Joseph Trapp; son, Percy Cunningham, Sr.; and grandson, Antonio Averetti.
