Obituary

Annie Lee Monroe was born on April 28, 1921, in Rockingham, N.C. to the late Leana Ingram and Moses Smith. Ann, as she was affectionately called, was a woman with a warm heart. She received salvation at an early age.

In 1939 after graduating from high school, Ann was united in holy matrimony to Hezekiah Monroe. From this union was born one daughter, Annie Mae

Monroe, who various family members referred to by a number of nicknames—Precious, Pumpkin, Possum and Pidgeon.
