Betty Louise Plummer was born in Washington, DC, she was the third of four children born to Grace L. and George W. Plummer, Sr. Betty attended Holy Name Elementary School; she graduated from Holy Trinity High School. Betty received both a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts degrees from Howard University in 1966 and 1969, respectively. Betty received her Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Maryland in 1984.

Dr. Plummer was a career academician, teaching history on a collegiate level. She was especially proud of the fact that she spent most of her teaching career at several Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). She retired from Xavier University of Louisiana in New Orleans, LA.

Betty is survived by several nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
