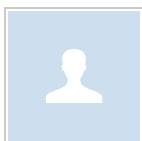

We especially loved the mornings with her because she would give us fried chicken and rice for breakfast. She also made the best scrambled eggs with ham and onions that I've ever tasted to this day. Nana lived with us twice, once in Trenton, NJ and once in Hayward, CA with my parents when I was an adult. Nana volunteered to make Christmas cookies for my elementary school class. They weren't your regular cookies that you make for children, they were all the cookies you see in magazines and I was so fascinated watching her. She let me help and I remember I had never seen so many containers of eggs. When I became an adult, she would call me sometimes on the weekends and tease me about not having a date when she did. I'm 53 years old and will be getting married for the first time in my life next year. I think she would have liked that and she would have already been looking for what she was going to wear.
