Christopher Douglas Stultz departed this life unexpectedly on Wednesday, June 12, 2024, in Lanham, Maryland. He was born to Janice Eloise Stultz and Leon Douglas Stultz in New Rochelle, New York. He was one of two children born to the couple. He attended public schools in Port Chester, New York; Charlotte, North Carolina, Camp Springs and Oxon Hill, Maryland. He graduated from Oxon Hill High School in 1987. After high school, he completed several certificate courses in Culinary Arts, and various technical trade specialties at Prince George's Community College.

Christopher accepted the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ at an early age in Port Chester, New York. He had many hobbies and interests which included basketball, football, soccer, martial arts, artistic drawing, wildlife animals, and Caribbean cuisine. He is preceded in death by his father, Leon Douglas Stultz; and leaves to cherish his memory, his mother Janice; sister Jennifer (Francis) Mercer; and several aunts, uncle, and cousins.
