“ I met Derrell 30 years ago and worked as his attorney in a case in which he served as a class representative for 235 NFL Players who were victims of a price-fixing conspiracy by the League and its Clubs. He was a stalwart client who endured the cross examination by League lawyers before and at trial. While the verdict he helped to secure was reversed on appeal, his efforts last to this day with a new type of practice squad in the League from which hundreds of players have benefited.

It took real courage for Derrell to stand up for his teammates when, like others, he still wanted to be a pro player. He was simply a standup guy, always friendly with me then a years later when he worked for the PG School system and I again represented him and his colleagues.
