Doris Veronica Hinton was born on August 4, 1928, to the late George and Mary Freeland. Her siblings that preceded her in death include Eugene Freeland, Mary Hawkins, Thomas G. At First Baptist Church of Glenarden, Doris continued her path of service as a member of the Nursing Home Ministry, the Sr. Choir and assisting with the Sunbeams Children's choir. After retiring, Doris moved to Norfolk, VA where she joined the Endtime United Ministries under Pastor Emeritus Joyce Washington. There she continued working with the Nursing Home Ministry and the Card Ministry, while assisting with the Outreach Ministry whenever possible. Doris served meals for the Loving Steps Program's Christmas dinners and was always eager to help the community.
