Edward (Edwin) Samuel Singletary was born November 20, 1942, to the late Reverend Fredrick and Susie Gorham Singletary in Remly's Point, Charleston County, South Carolina. As a pastor, husband, father, brother and friend, Edwin devoted his life to helping and serving others. His motto was, "With God, all things are possible."

Reverend Singletary lived his life to the fullest doing what he enjoyed the most, which was serving God for nearly 30 years. Throughout the State of New Jersey, he pastored several AME churches: Asbury, Mt. Pisgah, Fisk Chapel, Bethel, and Mt. Zion. Rev.
