Eugene Lawson Clark Smith was born on March 9, 1930 in Washington, DC to Curtis Jesse Smith, Sr. and Nelsie Clark Smith, and was the youngest of three children.

Eugene was educated in the DC public school system and attended B.K. Bruce Elementary School and Armstrong High School. He was then drafted into the US Army and served in the Korean War. During his military career, he attended military leadership school and was a corporal in the military police. He continued his government service as a civilian working for the Army and Air Force Motion Picture Service and US Customs.

Eugene joined the Catholic church and was a member of Saint Gabriel's parish.

Eugene and his ex-wife, Gwendolyn Carter, were the proud parents of two children, Monique and Claude.

Affectionately called "Smitty" or "Gene" by family and friends, Eugene often shared many stories of his childhood and military service. He had a great love for sports and especially enjoyed watching the Redskins play.
