



Eula Mae Dozier

January 17, 1915 - March 9, 2020

Eula Mae Dozier transitioned on March 9, 2020 after a long life of 105 years. She was born January 17, 1915, the second child of four children, to the late Claude Freeman and Ola (Madden) Freeman in Jonesboro, Georgia. She was educated in the public school system and completed the ninth grade at Fountain Inn High School in Fountain Inn, SC. Eula Mae and her husband Jessie Dozier married on July 24, 1937 and celebrated 51 years of marriage before he passed in 1989. They moved from South Carolina to Washington DC around 1939. They had two children; their son Michael who preceded her in death and a daughter, Anna. For many years, Eula did day work for a couple of families who were very fond of her. Sometime later she became a Housewife.

Eula received salvation in her early teens in 1929 at the New Durbin Baptist Church in Fountain Inn, SC. She was an active member serving in the church, Sunday School and Sunday School Convention. She could sing and would be asked to sing at either of those venues and even at other churches. At the Sunday School Convention, she was asked to read an essay on the "Betterment of the Sunday School Convention." After having an operation on her tonsils, she lost her voice and could no longer sing.

Eula and Jessie joined St Phillips Baptist Church at North Capitol and K Streets NW when they moved to DC. In the early 70's, Eula started going to Evangel Cathedral (formerly Evangel Temple at the York Theater in Washington, DC). She would go every Sunday. She had to stop attending

Evangel Cathedral when her husband became ill and she didn't start going back until after he passed. She remained faithful until health challenges kept her from attending.

She loved God and loved reading the Bible. From her memoir, we know she had a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus. She mentioned she heard her Lord talking all night. She would put God first. Her love was shown by how she loved others. She loved to help others and had a giving heart. She helped her neighbors giving them food and clothes. She loved the neighborhood children and would give them cookies and candy. She helped raise her grandsons Craig and Eric and her nephew, Willie King. She had special relationships with one of her nieces, Helen Trice, ex-daughter-in-law, Ondraya Hall and ex-son-in-law, Jonathan Caldwell.

In 2018 when she was 103, DC Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton, to the U.S. House of Representatives, acknowledged her birthday by sending a certificate and a U.S. American flag that was flown over the U.S. Capitol on that day.

Eula was a good cook and loved looking at baseball. Her family and guests loved her homemade yeast rolls and curry chicken. She would prepare her children whatever they wanted to eat every day. It would always result in two different meals. She would be glued to the TV during the baseball world series.

To cherish her memory is her loving, devoted daughter, Anna, her grandchildren Paul, Craig (Toni), Monica and Eric (Jessica), nine great grandchildren, seven great great grandchildren, a hosts of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
