Harold Floyd Green (Floyd) also called Uncle Floyd, Slick (nickname given by eldest brother, James) was born December 7, 1930 to the late James Green, Sr. and Julia Green. Floyd was the eighth of ten children born from the union of James and Julia. Floyd was reared on the Green family farm in Saluda County, South Carolina. He began working his parent's farm at a young age. The Green family raised cotton, hogs, chickens, turkeys and other produce. Floyd often worked with his brothers James and Rudy on the daily farming chores. Floyd was educated in South Carolina, and continued to work the farm until he was 16 years old when he decided to relocate to Washington, D.C. When Floyd arrived in D.C. he took a job at the Pentagon until he migrated to Queens New York in the early 1950's. At which time he worked as a brick laborer and maintenance worker. There he met and married Doris L. Outland. From their union they had one daughter, Pamela Marie Green.

Floyd returned to Washington D.C. in 1970. He worked with his brother James at the Plain "n' Fancy Donut Shop in Fort Meade Maryland as his brother's baker's helper. He later worked as a mechanic at Martin's Auto Shop in D.C. His last position was working with his nephew, Larry, at Fort Meyers Construction Company where he retired.

Floyd enjoyed serving the Lord. He was a faithful member of the Greater New Hope Baptist Church for over 50 years. He was a dedicated usher on Usher

Board No.2.

“Uncle Floyd” passionately called by his nieces and nephews, enjoyed being with his family. He was the uncle that loved to joke, laugh, listen to music, dance, play pitty pat with his sister, Sylvia and friends. 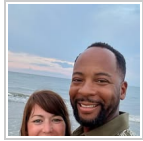
