Ida was an outstanding local president for AFGE local 25 for approximately 20 years. This was truly a great person who successfully represented everyone who came to her for help. No person was ever refused, to include the ones who had personal differences. Yes, president Ida represented the ones who tried to harm her. Family and friends should know that Ida was a living legend during her life. Ida was the first and only person in the history of the Veterans administration to win a full blown Race and sex discrimination case against the veterans administration. This was a nationwide precedent setting case that is still used today as a guide how to litigate performance based racial discrimination cases in the federal government. This was a tireless soldier who had batteries stronger than the eveready bunny. Ida even represented people outside of her local union. Federal Government managers feared Ida because Ida carried herself in such a way that when she spoke, you knew she meant business and nothing but business. Ida loved The American Federation of Government Employees local 25 members, and our entire union loved Ida Wise-Jefferson. Ida will be sadly missed by those who knew her and on behalf of AFGE District 14, and our entire union family, we sincerely appreciate everything Miss Ida did for us. By the way, I always referred to Ida as Miss Ida or Mrs. Wise. I also demonstrated the proper respect because I did not want to get Ms. Ida upset.
