March 19, 1943 - January 14, 2020

Jacquelyn Doretta Carter, 76, daughter of late military veteran, James Lovette Reid and late Bettie Reid Simmons, was born March 19, 1943 in Washington, D.C. at Freedmen's Hospital. Jacquelyn's entrance into God's heavenly gates took place on January 14, 2020.

She married the late James Earl Carter, Jr. in 1965. Their blessed union produced a beautiful baby girl named June Maria Carter.

In 1961, Jacquelyn graduated from Theodore Roosevelt Sr. High School in Washington, D.C. and majored in Business Administration at a historical black college, Saint Paul's College, in Lawrenceville, Virginia. Shortly after, she began her public service career in the Federal Government at the Department of Treasury and continued her service at the Department of Labor working for the Employment Training Administration where she retired after 37 years.

Simultaneously, she worked as a beautician following in the footsteps of her entrepreneurial mother, Lady Bettie. Later, she joined the Hillendale Baptist Church where she served administratively in the church's office. Notably, Jacquelyn worked with the George Washington University Heart Institute with Dr. Marco Mercader and his team testing new methods to improve the heart function. She also worked with Maryland State Senator of the 21st District, Jim Rosapepe, on several occasions that present an ongoing benefit to

Marylanders.

Jacquelyn had a true gift in helping others. She loved to assist in creating policies and ensure existing regulations were being followed to help habitants of Maryland nursing and rehabilitation centers. She concurrently assisted her family member who currently lives in a rehabilitation center. Her life was full of service to family, friends, and the community.

She's survived by her daughter, June Maria Carter, her Aunt, Elizabeth Jones, her first cousins: Linda A. Jenkins, Angela Simms, and Samuel Gantt, and a host of relatives and friends.
