Joan Elizabeth Evans entered into eternal rest on February 1, 2021 at Washington Hospital Center in Washington, DC.

Joan was born on December 28, 1948, in Chapel Oaks, Maryland, the “Baby Girl” of the family.

Joan was educated in the District of Columbia Public School System and graduated from Joel Elias Spingarn High School in 1967.

Joan worked within the District of Columbia Government and the Office of Pay and Retirement Services, Payroll Operations Division. She retired on April 29, 2005 with a total of 35 years of service. She received various awards for her exemplary public service, commitment, dedication and teamwork.

On October 10, 2003, she was baptized and became a member of Founder and Pastor, Bishop L. N. Forbes’ Faith Temple No. 2, Original Free Will Baptist Church, in Capitol Heights, Maryland. Joan enjoyed attending church and often volunteered her services, always willing to give a helping hand.
