Dr. Johnelia Philippa Hardy Armstrong, J.D., also known as “JP” and “Madame Butterfly” was born to Dr. John Garrick Hardy, PhD and Mrs. Mildred Elizabeth Motley Hardy on February 15, 1941 in Montgomery AL. Her parents were lifelong educators well known throughout the community in Montgomery. Dr. Hardy was a beloved faculty member at Alabama State University. Dr. Armstrong was an only child but grew up with several cousins and her closest friend (and was truly her sister) that she met in kindergarten, Nerissa Mann. After her graduation, Dr. Armstrong attended Howard University in Washington DC. She became a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., completed her undergraduate degree, and went on to complete Law School earning her Juris Doctorate.

After her graduation she moved to Los Angeles, CA and held a number of positions before starting a career with the Employment Development Department as an Employment Claims Specialist. She also met and married her former husband, Hermon C. Armstrong, Sr. and they had one son, Hermon Cortez Armstrong, Jr. Although they divorced after 21 years of

marriage, they remained close friends until Hermon Sr.'s death in 2017. After 21 dedicated years working for the State of California, Dr. Armstrong retired and moved back to Montgomery, AL.

Throughout her life she was a devout Christian, a dedicated daughter, a loving mother, surrogate sister, and a dedicated friend. In 2015 she moved to Maryland to be closer to her Son and made many cherished memories with him and her longtime friends from college.
