He enjoyed collaborating in the studio with his friend Nigel, writing songs for Eden, rapping, creating beats, and throwing large dance parties with his college friends from Howard University. He even danced with Beyonce on the TV dance party show called Planet Groove.

Athletically, Kenny was a talented basketball and football player throughout his high school and college years. He loved playing pick-up games and he also decided to become a basketball coach in 2010 for Team Matrix, which allowed him to coach his daughter, Genisis. His basketball coaching career led him to start his own non-profit organization called “Team Intensity” in 2014. Kenny continued to showcase his leadership by coaching the Annandale varsity high school team in the 2022-23 season. Additionally, he contributed to the community by taking on coaching responsibilities at the Annandale Boys

and Girls Club for soccer and county league basketball. He also previously coached CYO basketball at Saint Anthony's and Corpus Christi. Kenny was leading the undefeated Annandale girls' soccer team and gearing up for the county basketball season with his team, which included his daughter, Eden.

He was a real people person, with a natural gift for making friends. His ability to connect with people on a personal level and make them laugh, left a lasting impression. Kenny's legacy lives on through the countless lives he touched as a father, partner, coach, and friend. His proud coaching moments, inspiring young girls to play basketball, will forever echo in the memories of those who had the privilege of being part of his teams.
