Levi Duppree Carter was born on July 13, 1966 and was raised in a loving home by his beloved grandmother, Elizabeth Mary Carter. He enjoyed his early childhood development in fellowship with Plymouth Congregational United Church of Christ and the District of Columbia public schools, where he was a member of the football and basketball leagues.

At Plymouth Church he was an active member of the Boy Scout Troop, Youth Choir and the Young Adult Sunday School Class. He also accompanied his grandmother and served as a driver for her to visit the sick and shut-in in her role as a Deaconess.

In 1984, Levi enlisted in the United States Marine Corp where he served honorably until 1988. In 1989, he was called to serve as a Marine in the

Persian Gulf War and was again honorably discharged in 1991. Until his health began to fail in 2004, Levi enjoyed police work and was employed by CES Security Systems and Ames as a special police officer.

Though he had health challenges, he cared for his beloved grandmother after the death of his mother, Shirley Carter. For nearly two years he provided twenty-four hour care for his grandmother and often expressed deep sorrow and loss when she died on November 22, 2004.

On November 13, 2005, Levi went home to be with his mother, Shirley and his dearly beloved grandmother, Elizabeth Mary Carter.
