“ Louise Thomas, better known as the well respected Miss Louise is one of the pillars and foundation of Martha's Table. She lived in the neighborhood of 14th and W Streets and was well known in the community long before Martha's Table started in an old dilapidated building in early 1980's The founder, Dr. Veronica Maz sought her help among other community leaders to link the services of Martha's Table with those in need especially the homeless and the children whom she encouraged to be entrepreneurs by providing the means for them to start a small business like baking and selling homemade items.

Louise served as a volunteer until invited by Olivia Ivy ,then operations manager to serve as a part-time paid staff preparing the food and soup served daily from the McKenna's Wagon with the help of volunteers. Well or sick, Miss Louise would come to prepare the soup when no one could or would. Stirring almost 60 + gallons of soup in a heavy pot was no easy job but she did it with no complaint including the cleaning and the washing leaving the kitchen spotlessly clean after everyone had left for the day.

Louise worked hard without seeking recognition . She was the "frontliner" serving at the backdoor when the needy were denied help at the front door because it was against the rule. Miss Louise very often was the last recourse for those who had nowhere to go for their meal or clothes or milk for the children and even the last few dollars she may have earned. She was also one of those who helped organize with the help of her daughter Debbie for the low income renters like her have a coop in the building for them to eventually own their own apartment. Miss Louise will be remembered by many whom she had helped but not known because she was meek and humble of heart and followed only God's command, "love thy neighbor as thyself".

As she meets her Maker, Louise Thomas will be greeted with these words, "Come you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I

was hungry and you gave me food I was thirsty and you gave me drink a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me... And the King will say to them in reply, Amen , say to you whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me"
