Marcus Orlando Currie, also known as “Hollywood” passed away on Tuesday, February 25, 2020, after a brave battle with a long illness. While in high school, Marcus worked for Safeway Stores until his health allowed him. He started his own company, THRAXX, working with friends in music. Most recently, Marcus had finally found a job he loved a profession he so desired to be in. He worked for

Shapiro & Brown LLC. While he had his ups and downs, Marcus always had a game plan and knew exactly what he wanted to do.

Marcus had so many hobbies and interests. He loved music, that is what his business revolved around. He loved fishing. At a young age joined a fishing club and on his first trip, he was so excited about the fish he caught. He came home with a cooler full of fish. We had fish for months! He had a passion for cooking and grilling. If you wanted to know how to cook or prepare a dish, he was the one to call on. You would catch him grilling all year long. To this day he was the only one who knew how to cut on and off the gas grill. He was an avid all around player of sports, with basketball his favorite sport. Marcus started playing basketball with the DC Recreation Department and Metropolitan Police Boys and Girls Club at a young age.
