October 2, 1928 - November 21, 2011

Passed away on November 21, 2011 at the age of 83 at Howard University Hospital. Born and raised in Baltimore, MD, but resided in the Washington DC area for the past 50 years. He was the son of the late John Ford and Mable Fox. He graduated from Frederick Douglas High School in Baltimore, and attended Howard University and Antioch Law School. He was a WWII Veteran and worked in the field of Biology/Virology at NIH for 20 years. Marshall chaired an EEO committee at NIH, which led to his career change to the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity and Civil Rights at the Food and Drug Administration. He retired as the Director of this office in 1985. Marshall loved people and sports, and belonged to several local tennis, golf and social clubs. He was an active member of Trinity Episcopal Church, DC where he served in many capacities since 1972. Marshall loved writing short stories and poetry and traveled extensively. He leaves to mourn his daughter, Michelle Ford Jackson, his grandchildren, Bruce Ford and Kevin Nolan Jackson, his son-in-law, Kevin Jackson and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends. He was preceded in death by his sisters, Johnnie Mae, Artelia, Jacolian, and his brother Charles Ford.
