Sometime in 2015, Rob met a new friend, Patricia “Patty” Finney, who was to play a central role in his life, from that time until his transition. Patty was from the Eastern Shore. After getting to know one another, they fell in love and were able to enjoy each other’s company despite his inability to make the long drive to Patty’s home. Patty drove over the bridge to see Rob! Lill knew Patty and approved of their friendship. When Rob faced health challenges, from 2015 on, Patty was Rob’s listener, advocate and helper. The two of them enjoyed watching television news programs, movies, comedy club performances; they collected coins, took short day trips, embarked on a cruise and listened to a variety of recorded music together.

On Friday, December 18, 2020, the Rev. Dr. Drummer by phone, united the two in Holy Matrimony, in the eyes of God, and Rob and Patty planned to complete forms required for their marriage to be legally recognized. Family members and friends witnessed their marriage vows by teleconference. Rob’s ensuing very serious illness and subsequent hospitalization prevented their ability to register their marriage as required by law. Sadly, he transitioned before the legal papers could be obtained.

During Rob’s spate of illness in spring, 2020, Patty gave up her home and found employment nearby Rob’s home. She wanted to be near enough to help care for him. Her love, attention and advocacy for him were superb. She was the angel God sent to walk beside him until the end. We, the family, thank you, Patty for your loving devotion and steadfastness. For many, many days, you spent the nights at the hospital, consulted with his physicians and nurses, and most importantly, encouraged Rob’s will to survive. We are in your eternal debt for the many ways you cared for him and brought happiness and light to his life at a very difficult time for him. We love you and thank you for your loving dedication. You were with him

when we, family members, were not there. We relied on you and trusted you. Rob deeply loved you and I'm sure, his spirit is with you now. May God shower you with blessings you for all you did for Rob and his family.

Rob and Rob's Family

Rob, our mother's second Waller grandson, was dearly loved by his family. He lived a life of personal integrity, humility and love for his nuclear and extended families. He was a son, brother, nephew, father, cousin and devoted friend we loved and for whom we had the highest regard. It was not easy for a young Black male to grow up in the 1960s-80s and remain unscarred by the societal evils of the day, but ROB DID. He worked ardently, and took responsibility for his family, business and for his choices.

What a wonderful gift and present he has been to our family. He was devoted to his children, Kweisi and Sequoia; parents: Lill, Robert Earl, George and Sallie; his grandmothers, brother, and all other kin. His kindness and charitable attitude extended to the generation that preceded and succeeded him. He never gave the family one moment's worry. A very intelligent youth and young man, he was always friendly, calm and caring. All the family was thrilled when Rob and Rodney were baptized at Gethsemane. He married and truly was delighted and felt blessed to be the father of Kweisi and Sequoia. Their needs, plans and goals were primary to him. He continued to be a very loving and generous father to them as long as he lived. Rob was especially considerate of his Mother, Lillian, who dubbed him "her father" as he called daily to check on her well-being beginning about 2014, after his stepfather, George, became ill. Rob did not complain about his own physical condition and its possible prognosis; he never lost heart.

Rob, the Businessman

After successfully working in other capacities, following his time at Norfolk State College, Rob decided to establish a landscaping business which he named Scrubnik Enterprises. An innovative and skilled businessman, Rob enjoyed the outdoors, and developed a profound interest in horticulture. He became knowledgeable about soil, plants, grasses, landscaping design and many ancillary topics.

Rob was creative and had an eye for beauty and design. His honesty, reliability, and desire for perfection in his workmanship as a landscaper won for him the loyalty of a great number of private and corporate customers, and in addition, government entities. Rob was highly professional; he gave customers the level and quality of service he himself would wish. He obtained computer software tools to plan help grow his business. Despite his illness, Rob continued to operate the enterprise, sometimes from his sickbed, by using a phone, his laptop computer and with the help of dedicated employees. Following his retirement, many former customers continued to request his services and were disappointed that he was unavailable to answer their pleas. For a while, when he was able, Rob was gratified to give landscaping work without charge to his church, Gethsemane Baptist.
