Sue Ann Sadler died March 7, 2009 after a brief illness.

An exuberant Democrat, she came to Washington in 1962, one of the many people who were energized by President Kennedy's call to public service. She served as administrative assistant to Secretary of Commerce Luther Hodges, executive assistant to U.S. Senator James Abourezk D-SD, and office manager and administrator for Fleischman and Walsh, LLP. Sue Ann was born September 19, 1932 in Tarboro, NC to Julius Trousdale Sadler and Sue Daly Sadler. She attended Tarboro High School, in Tarboro, NC, and graduated from St. Mary's School in Raleigh, NC, and Randolph Macon Women's College in Lynchburg, VA. She was an active member of Saint Columba's Episcopal Church in Washington, DC. Her brothers, Julius T. Sadler, Jr. of Litchfield, CT and John D. Sadler of Scranton, NC, predeceased her.

Sue Ann is survived by her nieces, Laura Sadler of Torrington, CT and Garrett Sadler of Lenox, MA; nephews Jason Sadler of Willits, CA and Don Sadler of Miami, FL; and her extended family in North Carolina.
