On Thursday, June 15th, 2006, Virginia H. Webb, daughter of the late Thomas Adkins and Mary Adkins Winfield, quietly departed this life.

Virginia, affectionately known as "Jenny" was born on February 22, 1944 in Carson, Virginia. She accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior and was baptized at Saint John Baptist Church in Stony Creek, Virginia at an early age. Jenny attended public schools in Dinwiddie County, Virginia. Soon after, she relocated to Washington, DC. In 1967, she met and married Melvin Webb. From this union, their daughter Vicki was born. Jenny attended nursing school and shortly thereafter went to work for Providence Hospital until her retirement in 2004.

Jenny was always the life of the party. Whenever there was a function and things got too quiet, she'd get up to tell a joke or do a dance to make you laugh just to liven up the party. And when you came up with the answer she'd say to you loudly, "There it is!" Many of you have probably heard that phrase from her. Jenny will be truly missed.
