“ Wilbert, until you and I were in the third grade, our two families lived within throwing distance of each other. We played mud pies and rolled truck tires together, and watched Papa Ed cook syrup across the road from our houses. We gathered Chinaberries to shoot from kid-made clothespin “guns”, and played marbles in the red clay in our front yard during summer mornings. We could do this kind of play only in the mornings, because our mothers gave us our baths in the early afternoon, put clean clothes on us and dared us to get dirty.

We were in the same grades and classrooms (our small town school had only one classroom per grade for most grades). We skipped the 5th grade together. But, I always knew you were the smarter of the two of us. Earning a Ph.D. meant that you took our families from elementary to post graduate education level. And, you did it without losing your humility, or your connection with your family.

Though our paths diverged after high school and rarely crossed for far too many years, I will miss you very, very much.
