



William Conway Walker

July 27, 1932 - January 2, 2021

On July 27, 1932 William Conway Walker began his Sunrise journey in Durham, North Carolina, where he was born to the late Chester and Alice Walker. He was the fifth of eight children and was frequently called "Bill". He transitioned from time to eternity on January 2, 2021 in the serenity of Sinai Hospital, Baltimore, MD.

During his Morning journey he was baptized into the body of Christ and became a member of St. Matthew CME Church, which is now known as Russell Memorial CME Church in Durham, North Carolina. In 2019, he became a member of Union Bethel AME Church in Brandywine, MD where he regularly attended until failing health prevented him from continuing to do so.

His Noonday journey began with his education in Durham, North Carolina, where he graduated in June of 1949 from Hillside High School earning a high school diploma, and attended North Carolina Central University, in Durham, North Carolina for one year. He joined the United States Army in 1953. He was sent to Ft. Gordon, GA where he took his basic training for 8 weeks. After his basic training he was stationed to the 515th MP (Military Police) Detachment, in Fort Lee, VA as a MP Desk Sergeant/Senior Military Police Officer. In 1954 he married Lorretta D. Wyles, to this union they had four sons. In 1963 he moved his family to Asmara, Ethiopia. His tours included 1959-1960, (Stockade), Korea to 249th MP (Military Police) Detachment; 1960-1964

US Army 515th MP (Military Police) Senior Military Policeman; 1964-1966 US Army HQ Company USA STRATCOM Fac, Asmara (Sargent); 1966-1967 US Army 572nd MP (Military Police) Company, Fort Richie, MD; 1967-1968 – US Army 281st MP (Military Police) Guard CO. APO San Francisco, CA.(Vietnam) While in the US Army he received several decorations/medals/commendations: Meritorious Service Medal, Bronze Star Metal, Air Metal, Army Commendation Medal; Good Conduct Medal; National Defense Service Medal; Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross w/Palm; Vietnam Service Medal; Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. After serving 24 years to the US Army he retired as a Sargent First Class in 1976.

William began the Evening phase of his life in 1977 working for the US Library of Congress as a Special Police Officer and later retired in 1997 after 20 years. He enjoyed watching sports, his favorite team was the Washington Football Team (Formerly the Redskins), and spending time with his senior friends at Cameron Grove playing his favorite card game of “Poker”. He was a member of the American Legion Post 275, and Merryman’s Club. He had a very giving heart. He loved his family dearly and relished each and every one with his kindness.

Now it’s Sunset. He leaves to cherish his loving memory his three sons, Ronald Walker of Ettrick, VA; Michael (Brentis) of Hopewell, VA; Phillip Eric (Linda) of Fort Washington, MD; three sisters Mrs. Theresa W. Glover, of Florence, SC; Mrs. Shirley Sneed of Mitchellville, MD; Mrs. Barbara Lewis (James) of Durham, NC; one sister-in-law Alice Robinson Walker, of Petersburg, VA; one grandson Oronde Walker (Tykeria) of Pensacola, FL; 2 great grandchildren; a devoted friend Ms. Erma Hinton, along with a host of loving and caring nieces, nephews, extended relatives and beloved friends. His life was a gift and we all were blessed to have shared him.

In addition to his parents, William is now enjoying the pleasures of Heaven with his wife Lorretta Wyles Walker and his oldest son Conway Walker, brothers: Joseph Walker, Thomas Walker, his sisters Gladys Walker Manning,

and Bertie Walker Bates and other loved ones gone before.

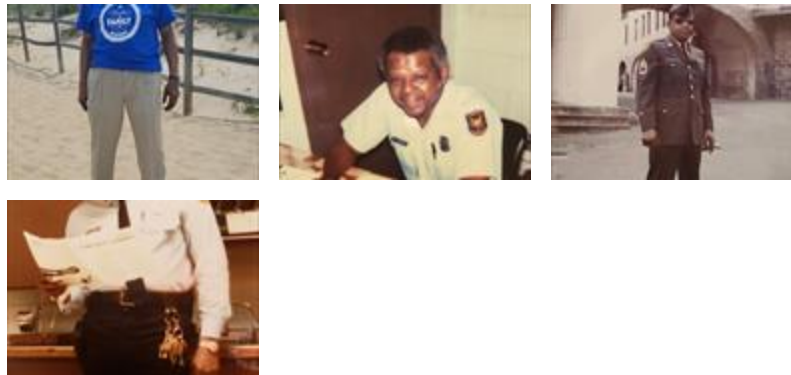
