Wilson C. Monk Sr. was, God born August 6, 1919 in Philadelphia Pennsylvania. At his home on July 21, 2013, God saw fit to call his servant to rest.

He attended public school in Pleasantville, New Jersey, and later entered the Army on June 10, 1941. Wilson served as Battalion Master Sergeant at Omaha beach during the Normandy invasion.
